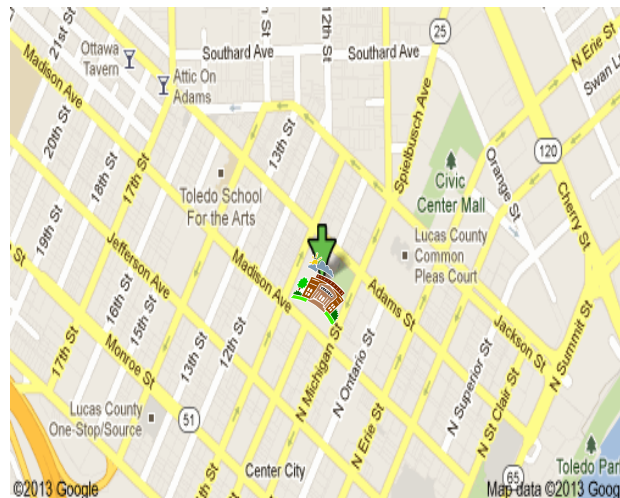

# ROAD WORK AHEAD: REVISITING THE PATH TO REENTRY

## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Each year about 730,000 federal and state prisoners travel the path of returning to their communities after a period of incarceration. This path can be challenging and often overwhelming because of obstacles such as employment, housing, substance abuse, healthcare, family issues, outstanding warrants -- and the list goes on. If reentry is successful, the community becomes both safer and stronger by reducing recidivism and adding a productive citizen.

Collaboration among service agencies and a determination to succeed by the ex-offender are keys to successful reentry. At this program, the extraordinary leaders of the Federal Bureau of Prisons and the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction, along with other federal and state leaders, will share their vision of a successful reentry path. These speakers will discuss available programs which help prepare ex-offenders to return to their community and family.

Reentry courts function successfully throughout the nation at both federal and state levels. This program will allow a dialogue between both court systems, addressing how these courts differ and what works. A panel of team members actually involved in reentry courts will explain how they coordinate with others to help solve the problems of participants.

Getting a job is often the most difficult challenge to overcome for persons with past felony convictions, but some employers are open minded. An employer who readily employs former inmates will tell you why reentry participants are attractive prospective employees. Successful reentry is the equivalent of having found a new way of life, and a recent graduate will share her successful path to a law-abiding and fulfilling future.

This program is essential for criminal defense lawyers, probation/parole officers, community and faith-based leaders, social service agencies, and all those involved in the criminal justice system as we address both the human and economic issues facing recidivism and reentry.
