## **Speaker Biography**



Mr. James R. Willis, Esq.

James R. Willis earned his Bachelors of Science form West Virginia State university and his LL.B from Western Reserve University (now Case Western Reserve University). He was admitted to practice in Ohio in 1953 and has spent his career as a criminal defense litigator with particular focus on capital cases and appellate law. Mr. Willis is also admitted to practice in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Ohio and the Eastern District of North Carolina, as well as the United States Court of Appeals Sixth and Eleventh Circuits. He has argued two cases before the Supreme Court of the United States and has litigated six cases that have been granted certiorari by the Court. Mr. Willis is a civil rights activist and has served as the first African American President of the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers (1974-1975) and as an advisor to the NAACP's local and national chapters. Mr. Willis is a Senior Partner at Willis & Watson Law in Cleveland, Ohio. In addition to his public service as a criminal defense attorney, Mr. Willis is also an United States Marine Corps veteran having served in the first all-Black regiment formed at Camp Montford Point in Jacksonville, North Carolina.
